LETTERS PATENT

Ontario Corporation

WHEREAS an application has been filed to incorporate a Corporation without share capital under the name

ONTARIO RINGETTE ASSOCIATION

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Consumer and Commercial Relations is the member of the Executive Council to whom the administration of the Corporation Act is assigned.

THEREFORE I, by virtue of the aforesaid powers vested in me, do by these Letters Patent issue a charter constituting the applicants named in the application which is attached hereto and which forms part of these Letters Patent and any other person who become members of the Corporation hereby created, a Corporation without share capital in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND DECLARED that the Letters Patent shall also contain and be subject to the following terms, conditions and provisions:

The Corporation shall be carried on without the purpose of gain for its members and any profits or other accretion to the Corporation shall be used in promoting its Objects;

The Corporation is prohibited from occupying and using a house, room or place as a club which, except for the provisions of Paragraphs (a) and (b) of Subsection (2) of Section of The Criminal Code (Canada), would be a common gaming house within the meaning of “common gaming house” as appears under Subsection (1) of the said Section 179; and if it is made to appear to the satisfaction of the Minister that the Corporation purports so to use a house, room or place, these Letters Patent may be cancelled by and in the discretion of the Lieutenant Governor;

If it is made to appear to the satisfaction of the Minister that the premises occupied by the Corporation are equipped, guarded or otherwise constructed or operated so as to hinder or prevent lawful access to and inspection of such premises by police or fire officers or are found fitted or provided with any game of chance or any mixed game or with any device for concealing, means or contrivance, these Letter Patent may be cancelled at the discretion of the Lieutenant Governor;

Nothing in these Letters Patent shall be construed as a grant of a license within the meaning of Subsection 2 of Section 179 of the Criminal Code (Canada).

WE THE APPLICANTS HEREBY APPLY TO YOUR HONOR TO ISSUE BY LETTERS PATENT A CHARTER UNDER THE CORPORATIONS ACT CONSTITUTING US AND ANY OTHER WHO BECOME MEMBERS OF THE CORPORATION WITHOUT SHARE CAPITAL THEREBY CREATED A CORPORATION WITHOUT SHARE CAPITAL AND IN SUPPORT THEREOF STATE THE FOLLOWING:

1. **OF THE APPLICANTS IS EIGHTEEN OR MORE YEARS OF AGE.**
2. **THE NAME OF THE CORPORATION TO BE INCORPORATED IS ONTARIO RINGETTE ASSOCIATION.**
3. **THE OBJECTS FOR WHICH THE CORPORATION IS TO BE INCORPORATED ARE:**
 - (a) To promote, govern and develop the playing of Ringette™ as a mass participation team sport within the Province of Ontario.
 - (b) To formulate and administer policies beneficial to the sport of Ringette™.
 - (c) To foster the highest standards of sportsmanship and friendliness for all participants.
 - (d) To stimulate public awareness and foster spectator interest.
 - (e) To encourage participation as a healthful exercise for improving physical fitness.
 - (f) To promote orderly development of the game and to strive for conditions conducive to the safety of all participants.
 - (g) To encourage participants to strive for excellence in team work, team spirit and team discipline.
 - (h) To actively promote the objectives and policies of the National Association as approved by their Directors through specified structures.

- (i) To provide Clinics and Courses in such areas of expertise as, but not limited to officiating, coaching, leadership and player development within Ringette™.
- (j) The Corporation has the power to accept donation, gifts, legacies and bequests.
- (k) Upon dissolution of the Corporation and after the payment of all debts and liabilities, its remaining property shall be distributed or disposed of to charitable organizations, which carry on their work solely in Ontario.

4. **THE HEAD OFFICE OF THE CORPORATION IS TO BE SITUATED IN THE City OF Toronto IN THE Municipality OF Metropolitan Toronto IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.**

1.0 ARTICLE I GENERAL

- 1.1 PURPOSE** These By-laws relate to the general conduct of the affairs of the Ontario Ringette Association.
- 1.2 DEFINITIONS** The following terms have these meanings in these By-laws:
- 1.2.1 *Act* – the Ontario Corporations Act or any successor legislation including the Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, 2010 (upon becoming law).
 - 1.2.2 *Auditor* – an individual appointed by the Members at the Annual Meeting to audit the books, accounts, and records of the Corporation for a report to the Members at the next Annual Meeting in accordance with the Act.
 - 1.2.3 *Board* – the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
 - 1.2.4 *Corporation* – the Ontario Ringette Association.
 - 1.2.5 *Days* – days including weekends and holidays.
 - 1.2.6 *Director* – an individual elected or appointed to serve on the Board pursuant to these By-laws.
 - 1.2.7 *Officer* – an individual elected or appointed to serve as an Officer of the Corporation pursuant to these By-laws.
 - 1.2.8 *Ordinary Resolution* – a resolution passed by a majority of the votes cast on that resolution.
 - 1.2.9 *Region* – A geographical area defined by the Board of Directors which is composed of Registered Members, situated in the designated geographical area who have adopted the Association’s Bylaws, policies, rules and regulations.
 - 1.2.10 *Special Resolution* – a resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the votes cast on that resolution.
- 1.3 REGISTERED OFFICE** The registered office of the Corporation will be located within the Province of Ontario.
- 1.4 CORPORATE SEAL** The Corporation may have a corporate seal, which may be adopted and may be changed by Ordinary Resolution of the Board.
- 1.5 NO GAIN FOR MEMBERS** The Corporation will be carried on without the purpose of gain for its Members and any profits or other accretions to the Corporation will be used in promoting its objects.

- 1.6 RULING ON BY-LAWS** Except as provided in the Act, the Board will have the authority to interpret any provision of these By-laws that is contradictory, ambiguous, or unclear, provided such interpretation is consistent with the objects of the Corporation.
- 1.7 CONDUCT OF MEETINGS** Unless otherwise specified in these By-laws, meetings of Members and meetings of the Board will be conducted according to Robert’s Rules of Order (current edition).
- 1.8 INTERPRETATION** Words importing the singular will include the plural and vice versa, words importing the masculine will include the feminine and vice versa, and words importing persons will include bodies corporate. Words importing an organization name, title, or program will include any successor organizational name, title, or program.
- 1.9 HEADINGS** The headings used in the By-laws are inserted for convenience of reference only.

2.0 ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

- 2.1 CATEGORIES** The Corporation has the following category of Member:
- 2.1.1 Registered Member – A ringette club association that is registered as a member of the Corporation and has agreed to abide by the Corporation’s By-laws, policies, procedures, rules and regulations.
- 2.2 ADMISSION OF MEMBERS** 2.2.1 Admission of Members - No entity will be admitted as a Member of the Corporation unless:
- The candidate member has made an application for membership in a manner prescribed by the Corporation;
 - The candidate member has paid dues as prescribed by the Board;
 - The candidate member agrees to uphold and comply with the Corporation’s governing documents;
 - The candidate member meets any other condition of membership determined by the Board; and
 - The candidate member has been approved by majority vote as a Member by the Board or by any committee or individual delegated this authority by the Board.
- 2.3 MEMBERSHIP DUES AND DURATION** 2.5.2 Year – Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the membership year of the Corporation will be June 15th to June 14th.
- 2.5.3 Dues – Membership dues will be determined annually by the Board.
- 2.5.4 Duration – Membership duration is accorded on an annual basis and Members will re-new membership annually.
- 2.4 TRANSFER, SUSPENSION AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP** 2.4.1 Transfer – Membership in the Corporation is non-transferable.
- 2.4.2 Termination – Membership in the Corporation will terminate immediately upon:
- The expiration of the Member’s annual membership, unless renewed in accordance with these By-laws;
 - Resignation by the Member by giving written notice to the Corporation;
 - Dissolution of the Corporation;
 - The Member’s dissolution; or
 - By Ordinary Resolution of the Board or of the Members at a duly called meeting, provided fifteen (15) days notice is given and the Member is provided with reasons and the opportunity to be heard. Notice will set out the reasons for termination of membership and the member receiving the notice will be entitled to submit a written submission

opposing the termination.

- 2.4.3 May Not Resign – A Member may not resign from the Corporation when the Member is subject to disciplinary investigation or action until its conclusion to the satisfaction of the Corporation.
- 2.4.4 Arrears – A Member will be expelled from the Corporation for failing to pay membership dues or monies owed to the Corporation by the deadline dates prescribed by the Corporation.
- 2.4.5 Discipline – In addition to expulsion for failure to pay membership dues, a Member may be disciplined in accordance with the Corporation’s policies and procedures relating to the discipline of Members.
- 2.4.6 Dues Payable – Any dues, subscriptions, or other monies owed to the Corporation by suspended or expelled Members will remain due.

2.5 GOOD STANDING

- 2.5.1 Definition – A Member will be in good standing provided that the Member:
- Has not ceased to be a Member;
 - Has not been suspended or expelled from membership, or had other membership restrictions or sanctions imposed;
 - Has completed and remitted all documents as required by the Corporation;
 - Has complied with the By-laws, policies, and rules of the Corporation;
 - Is not subject to a disciplinary investigation or action by the Corporation, or if subject to disciplinary action previously, has fulfilled all terms and conditions of such disciplinary action to the satisfaction of the Board; and
 - Has paid all required membership dues.
- 2.5.2 Cease to be in Good Standing - Members that cease to be in good standing, as determined by the Board or a Disciplinary Panel will not be entitled to vote at meetings of the Members or be entitled to the benefits and privileges of membership until such time as the Board is satisfied that the Member has met the definition of good standing.

3.0 ARTICLE III

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

- 3.1 ANNUAL MEETING** The Corporation will hold meetings of Members at such date, time and place as determined by the Board within the Province of Ontario. The Annual Meeting will be held within fifteen (15) months of the last Annual Meeting and within six (6) months of the Corporation's fiscal year end. Any Member, upon request, will be provided, not less than twenty-one (21) days before the annual meeting, with a copy of the approved financial statements, auditor's report or review engagement report.
- 3.2 SPECIAL MEETING** A Special Meeting of the Members may be called at any time by Ordinary Resolution of the Board or upon the written requisition of ten percent (10%) or more of the Members for any purpose connected with the affairs of the Corporation that does not fall within the exceptions listed in the Act or is otherwise inconsistent with the Act, within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the deposit of the requisition.
- 3.3 PARTICIPATION/HOLDING BY ELECTRONIC MEANS** Upon the discretion of the Board, any person entitled to attend a meeting of Members may participate in the meeting by telephonic or electronic means that permits all participants to communicate adequately with each other during the meeting if the Corporation makes such means available. A person so participating in a meeting is deemed to be present at the meeting. The Directors may determine that the meeting be held entirely by telephonic or electronic means that permit all participants to communicate adequately with each other during the meeting.
- 3.4 NOTICE** Written or electronic notice of the date of the Annual Meeting of the Members will be given to all Members in good standing, Directors, and the Auditor at least ten (10) days and not more than fifty (50) days prior to the date of the meeting. Notice will contain a reminder of the right to vote by proxy or by absentee ballot, a proposed agenda, reasonable information to permit Members to make informed decisions, nominations of Directors, and the text of any resolutions or amendments to be decided.
- 3.5 WAIVER OF NOTICE** Any person who is entitled to notice of a meeting of the Members may waive notice, and attendance of the person at the meeting is a waiver of notice of the meeting, unless the person attends the meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business on the grounds that the meeting was not lawfully called in accordance with these By-laws.
- 3.6 ERROR OR OMISSION IN GIVING NOTICE** No error or omission in giving notice of any meeting of the Members shall invalidate the meeting or make void any proceedings taken at the meeting.
- 3.7 NEW BUSINESS** No other item of business will be included in the notice of the meeting of the Members unless notice in writing of such other item of business, or a Member's

proposal, has been submitted to the Board sixty (60) days prior to the meeting of the Members in accordance with procedures as approved by the Board. Copies of all such proposals together with copies of any amendments thereto then proposed by the Board and copies of all resolutions put forward by the Board shall be sent to all Members with the agenda and the notice calling an Annual Meeting.

3.8 QUORUM Twenty-five percent (25%) of the Members present or by proxy will constitute a quorum. If a quorum is present at the opening of a meeting of the Members, the Members present may proceed with the business of the meeting, even if a quorum is not present throughout the meeting.

3.9 CLOSED MEETINGS Meetings of Members will be closed to the public except by invitation of the Board.

3.10 AGENDA

- 3.10.1 Call to order
- 3.10.2 Establishment of quorum
- 3.10.3 Approval of the agenda
- 3.10.4 Approval of minutes of the previous Annual Meeting
- 3.10.5 Presentation and approval of reports
- 3.10.6 Report of Auditors
- 3.10.7 Appointment of Auditors
- 3.10.8 Presentation of Budget
- 3.10.9 Approval of membership dues and related fees
- 3.10.10 Business as specified in the meeting notice
- 3.10.11 Election of new Directors
- 3.10.12 Adjournment

3.11 SCRUTINEERS At the beginning of each meeting, the Board may appoint one or more scrutineers who will be responsible for ensuring that votes are properly cast and counted.

3.12 ADJOURNMENTS With the majority consent of the Members present and quorum is ascertained, the Members may adjourn a meeting of Members and no notice is required for continuation of the meeting, if the meeting is held within thirty (30) days. Any business may be brought before or dealt with at any adjourned meeting which might have been brought before or dealt with at the original meeting in accordance with the notice calling the same.

3.13 ATTENDANCE The only persons entitled to attend a meeting of the Members are the Members, the Directors, the auditors of the Corporation (or the person who has been appointed to conduct a review engagement, if any) and others who are entitled or required under any provision of the Act or the articles to be present at the meeting. Any other person may be admitted only if invited by the Chair of the meeting or with the majority consent of the Members present at the meeting.

3.14 VOTING AT MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

3.1.1 Voting Privileges – Registered Members will have the following voting rights via Delegate at all meetings of Members:

- Registered Members will be entitled to one (1) vote for every one hundred (100) players (U6LTS through 30+ Masters) registered with the Corporation in the past season (September

15 – September 14).

For example:

- 1 – 100 registered players – 1 vote
- 101 – 200 registered players – 2 votes
- 201 – 300 registered players – 3 votes
- Etc.

- 3.15 DELEGATES** Registered Members will appoint in writing (inclusive of electronic notice) to the Corporation, seven (7) days prior to the meeting of Members, the name of the Delegate to represent the voting Member. Delegates must be at least eighteen (18) years of age and of sound mind.
- 3.16 ELIGIBILITY OF VOTES** A date determined by the Board will be used to determine the number of votes a Member will hold at a meeting of the Members. The date will be no more than thirty (30) days prior to the meeting.
- 3.17 VOTING ON FUNDAMENTAL CHANGES** If there is more than one class of members, each class of Member will be permitted to vote separately on fundamental changes affecting the Corporation.
- 3.18 PROXY VOTING** Every Member entitled to vote at a meeting of Members may, by means of a proxy, appoint a proxy holder, or one or more alternate proxy holders, to attend and vote on behalf of the Member. The proxy holder need not be a Registered Participant. A proxy must:
- 3.18.1 Be signed by the Member;
 - 3.18.2 Be in a form that complies with the Act;
 - 3.18.3 Comply with the format stipulated by the Corporation; and
 - 3.18.4 Be submitted to the Registered Office of the Corporation at least two (2) business days prior to the meeting of the Members
- 3.19 ABSENTEE VOTING** A Member may vote in writing in advance of the meeting of the Members on published proposed resolutions and for the election of Directors by so indicating the vote to the registered office of the Corporation prior to the vote being taken.
- 3.20 VOTING PROCEDURES** Except upon the demand, by at least majority of the Members present, for a secret ballot prior to the vote being held, voting on resolutions or proposals other than the election of Directors will be held by means specified by the Board.
- 3.21 ORDINARY RESOLUTION** Except as otherwise provided in these By-laws, an Ordinary Resolution will decide each issue/motion/resolution.
- 3.22 WRITTEN RESOLUTION** A resolution signed by all the Members entitled to vote on that resolution at a meeting of the Members is as valid as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Members.

4.0 ARTICLE IV GOVERNANCE

- 4.1 COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD**
- 4.1.1 Directors – The Board will consist of **thirteen (13) Directors**.
- 4.1.2 Composition of the Board - The Board will consist of the following:
- Six (6) Regional Directors
 - Five (5) Directors-at-Large
 - One (1) Athlete Director
 - **The Past President**
- 4.1.3 Regions – As determined by the Board, the province will be divided into Regions (Central, Eastern, Northeastern, Northwestern Southern and Western) within which the Members of the Corporation operate. The Regions will adapt and apply to the Corporation’s by-laws for the purposes of their operation and election of their officers.
- 4.1.4 Regional Directors – The Chair of each Region, upon being elected by the Members within each Region, will become an ex-officio Director of the Corporation. The Region must submit the identity of the Regional Director within ten (10) days of the election to the Corporation.
- 4.1.5 Directors-at-Large – Directors-at-Large will be elected by the Members.
- 4.1.6 Athlete Director – The Athlete Director will be elected by the Members.
- 4.1.7 Past President – The Past President is defined as the immediate last person to occupy the position of President who completed their full term and was not re-elected as a Director, removed or resigned. The Past President will serve a minimum term of one (1) year, unless they resign are removed or vacate the office. If there is no Past President as defined herein, the position of Past President will remain vacant.**
- 4.2 ELIGIBILITY OF DIRECTORS**
- 4.2.1 Eligibility – To be eligible for as a Director, an individual must:
- Be eighteen (18) years of age or older;
 - Not have been found under the *Substitute Decisions Act*, 1992 or under the *Mental Health Act* to be incapable of managing property;
 - Have the power under law to contract;
 - Have not been declared incapable by a court in Canada or in another country; and
 - Not have the status of bankrupt.
- 4.2.2 Eligibility of Athlete Director – In addition to Section 4.7, any individual elected or appointed to hold the position as the Athlete Director will meet the eligibility criteria defined in the Athlete Director Eligibility Requirements.

4.2.3 Governance Conflict – Any individual who is a Director, excluding Regional Directors who may only assume the position as a Regional Committee Member, will resign from any governing position as a director, officer or committee member of any other ringette association within thirty (30) days of being elected or appointed as a Director of the Corporation.

4.3 ELECTION OF REGIONAL DIRECTORS

4.3.1 Election of Regional Directors – Regional Directors will be elected by the Regional Members for a two (2) year term at least fourteen (14) days prior to an Annual Meeting as follows:

- The Northwestern, Eastern and Southern Regional Directors will be elected in even numbered years at the Annual Meetings.
- The Northeastern, Central, and Western Regional Directors will be elected in odd numbered years at the Annual Meetings.

4.3.2 Number of Votes – Each voting member at a Regional election will be entitled to the number of votes described in these By-laws.

4.3.3 Elections – Regional Directors will be decided elected by majority vote of the Members situated in the Region in accordance with the following:

- One Valid Nomination – Winner declared by Ordinary Resolution.
- Two or More Valid Nominations – The nominee(s) receiving the greatest number of votes and Ordinary Resolution will be elected. In the case of a tie, the nominee receiving the fewest votes will be deleted from the list of nominees and a second vote will be conducted. If there continues to be a tie and more nominees than positions, the nominee receiving the fewest votes will be deleted from the list of nominees until there remains the appropriate number of nominees for the position(s) or until a winner is declared. If there continues to be a tie then the winner(s) will be declared by coin flip.

4.4 NOMINATIONS OF DIRECTORS-AT-LARGE

4.4.1 Call for Nominations – At least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Meeting, the Nominating Committee will issue a ‘Call for Nominations’ for Directors-at-Large using any means of communication. The ‘Call of Nominations’ will state the method which the nominations are to be made, the requirements for the position and the deadline for submission which will be no later than fifteen (15) days prior to the Annual Meeting.

4.5 NOMINATIONS OF ATHLETE DIRECTOR

4.5.1 Call for Nominations – At least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Meeting, the Nominating Committee will issue a ‘Call for Nominations’ for Athlete Representative Director using any means of communication. The ‘Call of Nominations’ will state the method which the nominations are to be made, the requirements for the position.

4.5.2 Nominations from the Floor – A qualified individual may be nominated from the floor of the meeting of the Members for a Director-at-Large and/or Athlete Director position(s) in accordance with the Act.

4.5.3 Nomination - Any nomination of an individual for election as a Director will:

- Include the written consent of the nominee by signed or electronic signature; and
- Be submitted to the Registered Office of the Corporation thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Meeting. This timeline may be extended by Ordinary Resolution of the Board.

4.5.4 Election of Director-at-Large and Athlete Director – The election of Directors-at-Large and Athlete Director will take place at an Annual Meeting of members as follows:

- The Athlete Director and Two (2) Directors will be elected to the Board at alternate Annual Meetings in odd numbered years; and
- Three (3) Directors will be elected in alternate Annual Meetings in even numbered years.

4.5.5 Elections – Elections of Director-at-Large and Athlete Director will be decided by majority vote of the Members in accordance with the following:

- Equal Number of Valid Nominations to Vacant Positions – Winners declared by Ordinary Resolution.
- More Valid Nominations than Vacant Positions –The nominee(s) receiving the greatest number of votes and Ordinary Resolution will be elected. In the case of a tie, the nominee receiving the fewest votes will be deleted from the list of nominees and a second vote will be conducted. If there continues to be a tie and more nominees than positions, the nominee receiving the fewest votes will be deleted from the list of nominees until there remains the appropriate number of nominees for the position(s) or until a winner is declared. If there continues to be a tie then the winner(s) will be declared by coin flip.

4.5.6 Post-Election Eligibility – An elected Director who does not meet the eligibility requirements for election as Director will have sixty (60) days to become eligible for the position or will be removed as a Director of the Corporation.

4.5.7 Terms (Excluding the Past President who will serve a one (1) year term) – Directors will serve terms of two (2) years and will hold office until their successors have been duly elected in accordance with these By-laws, unless they resign, are removed from or vacate their office.

4.6 REGISTRATION AND REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS

4.6.1 Resignation - A Director may resign from the Board at any time by presenting his or her notice of resignation to the Board. This resignation will become effective the date on which the notice is received by the registered office of the Corporation or at the time specified in the notice, whichever is later. When a Director who is subject to a disciplinary

investigation or action of the Corporation resigns, that Director will nonetheless be subject to any sanctions or consequences resulting from the disciplinary investigation or action.

4.6.2 Vacate Office - The office of any Director will be vacated automatically if:

- The Director resigns;
- The Director is found to be incapable of managing property by a court or under Ontario law;
- The Director is found by a court to be of unsound mind;
- The Director becomes bankrupt or suspends payment of debts or compounds with creditors or makes an authorized assignment in bankruptcy or is declared insolvent; or
- The Director dies.

4.6.3 Removal of Past President, Director-at-Large or Athlete Director – A Past President, Director-at-Large or Athlete Director may be removed by Ordinary Resolution of the Members at an Annual Meeting or Special Meeting provided the Director has been given reasonable written notice of, and the opportunity to be present and to be heard at, such a meeting. If the Directors holds an Officer’s position and is removed as a Director, their position as Officer will automatically be vacated.

4.6.4 Removal of Regional Director – A Regional Director may be removed by Ordinary Resolution of the Members situated in the applicable Region at a Meeting of the Region provided the Regional Director has been given reasonable written notice of, and the opportunity to be present and to be heard at, such a meeting. If the Directors holds an Officer’s position and is removed as a Director, their position as Officer will automatically be vacated.

**4.7 FILLING A
VACANCY ON
THE BOARD**

4.7.1 Director-at-Large and Athlete Director Vacancy - Where the position of a Director-at-Large or Athlete Director becomes vacant for whatever reason and there is still a quorum of Directors, the Board may appoint a qualified individual to fill the vacancy for a term expiring not later than the close of the next Annual Meeting. The total number of Directors so appointed may not exceed one-third of the number of Directors elected at the previous Annual Meeting.

4.7.2 Regional Director Vacancy - Where the position of a Regional Director becomes vacant for whatever reason, the Region must elect a new Regional Director to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term.

4.7.3 Past President Vacancy – Where the position of Past President becomes vacant because of removal, resignation or is vacated in accordance to Section 4.6.2, the position will remain vacant until a newly qualified Past President exists.

**4.8 MEETINGS OF
THE BOARD**

4.8.1 Call of Meeting – A meeting of the Board will be held at any time and place as determined by the President, or by written requisition of at least three (3) Directors.

4.8.2 Chair – The President will be the Chair of all Board meetings unless designated by the President. In the absence of the President, or if the

meeting of the Board was not called by the President, the Vice-President Administration (or designate) will be the Chair of the meeting.

- 4.8.3 Notice – Written notice, served other than by mail, of meetings of the Board will be given to all Directors at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled meeting. Notice served by mail will be sent at least fourteen (14) days prior to the meeting. No notice of a meeting of the Board is required if all Directors waive notice, or if those absent consent to the meeting being held in their absence.
- 4.8.4 Number of Meetings – The Board will hold at least four (4) meetings per year.
- 4.8.5 Quorum – At any meeting of the Board, quorum will be a majority of Directors.
- 4.8.6 Voting – Each Director is entitled to one vote, excluding the President who is not entitled to vote except in the case of a tie. Voting will be by a show of hands, written, or orally unless a majority of Directors present request a secret ballot. Resolutions will be passed upon Ordinary Resolution.
- 4.8.7 No Alternate Directors - No person shall act for an absent Director at a meeting of Directors.
- 4.8.8 Written Resolutions - A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors is as valid as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Board.
- 4.8.9 Closed Meetings – Meetings of the Board will be closed to Members and the public except by invitation of the Board.
- 4.8.10 Meetings by Telecommunications - A meeting of the Board may be held by telephone conference call or by means of other telecommunications technology. Directors who participate in a meeting by telecommunications technology are considered to have attended the meeting.

4.9 DUTIES OF DIRECTORS

- 4.9.1 Standard of Care – Every Director will:
 - Act honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the Corporation; and
 - Exercise the care, diligence and skill that a reasonably prudent person would exercise in comparable circumstances.

4.10 POWERS OF THE BOARD

- 4.10.1 Powers of the Corporation – Except as otherwise provided in the Act or these By-laws, the Board has the powers of the Corporation and may delegate any of its powers, duties, and functions.
- 4.10.2 Empowered – The Board is empowered, including but not limited to:
 - Make policies and procedures or manage the affairs of the Corporation in accordance with the Act and these By-laws;
 - Make policies and procedures relating to the discipline of Members, and have the authority to discipline Members in accordance with such policies and procedures;

- Make policies and procedures relating to the management of disputes within the Corporation and deal with disputes in accordance with such policies and procedures;
- Determine the Members that exist in each Region;
- Employ or engage under contract such persons as it deems necessary to carry out the work of the Corporation;
- Determine registration procedures, recommend membership dues, and determine other registration requirements;
- Enable the Corporation to receive donations and benefits for the purpose of furthering the objects and purposes of the Corporation;
- Make expenditures for the purpose of furthering the objects and purposes of the Corporation;
- Borrow money upon the credit of the Corporation as it deems necessary in accordance with these By-laws; and
- Perform any other duties from time to time as may be in the best interests of the Corporation.

5.0 ARTICLE V OFFICERS

5.1 COMPOSITION The Officers will be comprised of the President, Vice President Administration, Vice President Technical, Vice President Communications, and Vice President Finance who are all Directors-at-Large and who are elected into their positions by the Board for a one-year term immediately following an election of Directors at an Annual Meeting.

5.2 DUTIES The duties of Officers are as follows:

5.2.1 The President will be the chair of the Board, will preside at the Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation and at meetings of the Board unless otherwise designated, will be the official spokesperson of the Corporation, and will perform such other duties as may from time to time be established by the Board.

5.2.2 The Vice President Administration will, in the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the President, and will perform such other duties as may from time to time be established by the Board.

5.2.3 The Vice President Communications will be responsible for the documentation of all amendments to the Corporation's By-laws, will ensure that all official documents and records of the Corporation are properly kept, cause to be recorded the minutes of all meetings, will prepare and submit to each Meeting of the Members and other meetings a report of all activities since the previous Meeting of the Members or other meetings, will give due notice to all Members of the Meeting of the Members of the Corporation, and will perform such other duties as may from time to time be established by the Board.

5.2.4 The Vice President Finance will, subject to the powers and duties of the Board, keep proper accounting records as required by the Act, will cause to be deposited all monies received by the Corporation in the Corporation's bank account, will supervise the management and the disbursement of funds of the Corporation, when required will provide the Board with an account of financial transactions and the financial position of the Corporation, will prepare annual budgets, will oversee and supervise office staff, and will perform such other duties as may from time to time be established by the Board.

5.2.5 The Vice President Technical will maintain a portfolio of Program Committees as appointed by the Board of Directors and will perform such other duties as may from time to time be established by the Board.

5.3 OTHER OFFICERS The Board may determine other officer positions and appoint individuals to fill those positions. Other officers need not also be Directors.

5.4 DUTIES OF OTHER The duties of officers not listed in section 5.2 or appointed via section 5.3 are determined by the Board.

OFFICERS

**5.5 DELEGATION
OF DUTIES**

At the discretion of the Officer and with approval by Ordinary Resolution of the Board, any Officer may delegate any duties of that office to appropriate staff or committee of the Corporation.

**5.6 MULTIPLE
POSITIONS**

With the exception of the positions of President, Vice President Administration, Vice President Communications, Vice President Technical and Vice President Finance, a Director may hold multiple Officer positions.

5.7 REMOVAL

An Officer may be removed by Ordinary Resolution at a meeting of the Board or of the Members, provided the Officer has been given notice of and the opportunity to be present and to be heard at the meeting where such Ordinary Resolution is put to a vote.

5.8 VACANCY

Where the position of an Officer, excluding the President, becomes vacant for whatever reason and there is still a quorum of Directors, the Board may, by Ordinary Resolution, appoint a qualified individual to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the vacant position's term of office. If the President position becomes vacant, the Vice-President Administration shall become President and the Board may appoint a replacement for the position of Vice-President Administration from among the Directors.

6.0 ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

- 6.1 APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES** The Board may appoint such committees as it deems necessary for managing the affairs of the Corporation and may appoint members of committees or provide for the election of members of committees, may prescribe the duties and terms of reference of committees, and may delegate to any Committee any of its powers, duties, and functions.
- 6.2 STANDING COMMITTEES** The Board will have the following standing committees composed of Directors as follows:
- 6.2.1 Executive – Will consist of the President, Vice President Administration, Vice President Technical, Vice President Communications, and Vice President Finance who shall be responsible to oversee the day to day operations of the Corporation. The Executive Director, Technical Director, or any other staff of the Corporation may be invited to attend any meeting of the Executive Committee.
 - 6.2.2 Nominations – Will consist of at least a Chair and two additional Directors
 - 6.2.3 Appeals/Complaints – Will consist of at least a Chair and two additional Directors
 - 6.2.4 Finance Committee – Will consist of the Vice President Finance (chair), President, Executive Director and two (2) additional Directors. The Executive Director is a non-voting member.
 - 6.2.5 Program Committees – Will consist of regional representatives and Board appointed chairs.
- 6.3 SIZE** The size of any committee will not exceed seven (7) committee members including the chair of the committee and will be no less than three (3) committee members including the chair of the committee.
- 6.4 TERMS OF REFERENCE** The Board may establish the terms of reference and operating procedures for all Committees, and may delegate any of its powers, duties, or functions to any Committee.
- 6.5 VACANCY** When a vacancy occurs on any Committee, the Board may appoint a qualified individual to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the Committee’s term.
- 6.6 EX-OFFICIO** The Executive Committee members will be an ex-officio non-voting member of all Committees of the Corporation.
- 6.7 REMOVAL** The Board may remove any member of any Committee.
- 6.8 DEBTS** No Committee will have the authority to incur debts in the name of the Corporation.

7.0 ARTICLE VII FINANCE AND MANAGEMENT

- 7.1 FISCAL YEAR** Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the fiscal year of the Corporation will be April 1st to March 31st.
- 7.2 BANK** The banking business of the Corporation will be conducted at such financial institution as the Board may determine.
- 7.3 AUDITORS** At each Annual Meeting the Members will appoint an auditor to audit or conduct a review engagement of the books, accounts and records of the Corporation in accordance with the Act. The auditor will hold office until the next Annual Meeting. The auditor will not be an employee, Officer, or Director of the Corporation and must be permitted to conduct an audit or review engagement of the Corporation under the *Public Accounting Act, 2004*, as amended.
- 7.4 ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS** The Directors will approve financial statements (evidenced by signature of one or more Directors) of the Corporation of the last fiscal year of the corporation but not more than six (6) months before the Annual Meeting and present the approved financial statements before the Members at every Annual Meeting. A copy of the Annual Financial Statements will be provided to any Member requesting a copy of the Financial Statements not less than twenty-one (21) days before the Annual Meeting. The Financial Statements will include:
- 7.4.1 The financial statements
 - 7.4.2 The auditor's report
 - 7.4.3 Any further information respecting the financial position of the Corporation
- 7.5 BOOKS AND RECORDS** The necessary books and records of the Corporation required by these By-laws or by applicable law will be necessarily and properly kept. The books and records include, but are not limited to:
- 7.5.1 The Corporation's articles and By-laws;
 - 7.5.2 The minutes of meetings of the Members and of any committee of Members;
 - 7.5.3 The resolutions of the Members and of any committee of Members;
 - 7.5.4 The minutes of meetings of the Directors or any committee of Directors;
 - 7.5.5 The resolutions of the Directors and of any committee of Directors;
 - 7.5.6 A register of Directors;
 - 7.5.7 A register of Officers;
 - 7.5.8 A register of Members; and
 - 7.5.9 Account records adequate to enable the Directors to ascertain the financial position of the Corporation on a quarterly basis.
- 7.6 SIGNING** Contracts, agreements, deeds, leases, mortgages, charges, conveyances, transfers

- AUTHORITY** and assignments of property, leases and discharges for the payment of money or other obligations, conveyances, transfers and assignments of shares, stocks, bonds, debentures, or other securities, agencies, powers of attorney, instruments of proxy, voting certificates, returns, documents, reports, or any other instruments in writing to be executed by the Corporation will be executed by two (2) signatures and one will be at least an Officer or other individuals, as designated by the Board. In addition, the Board may direct a manner in which the person or persons by whom any particular instrument or class of instruments may or will be signed.
- 7.7 HIGH VALUE CONTRACTS** All financial instruments and contracts with a value larger than \$10,000 must be signed by two (2) Officers or other individuals as designated by the Board that hold the signing authority of the Corporation.
- 7.8 REMUNERATION** All Directors, Officers and members of Committees will serve their term of office without remuneration (unless approved by at a meeting of Members) except for reimbursement of expenses as approved by the Board. This section does not preclude a Director or member of a Committee from providing goods or services to the Corporation under contract or for purchase. Any Director or member of a Committee will disclose the conflict/potential conflict in accordance with these By-laws.
- 7.9 CONFLICT OF INTEREST** A Director, Officer or member of a Committee who has an interest, or who may be perceived as having an interest, in a proposed contract or transaction with the Corporation will disclose fully and promptly the nature and extent of such interest to the Board or Committee, as the case may be, will refrain from voting or speaking in debate on such contract or transaction, will refrain from influencing the decision on such contract or transaction, and will otherwise comply with the requirements of the Act regarding conflict of interest

8.0 ARTICLE VIII AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS

8.1 VOTING

These By-laws may only be amended, revised, repealed or added to:

8.1.1 Under the jurisdiction of the *Ontario Corporations Act*, by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the voting Members present at a meeting duly called to amend, revise or repeal these Bylaws. Upon affirmative vote, any amendments, revisions, addition or deletions will be effective immediately.

8.1.2 Under the jurisdiction of the *Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act*:

- By Ordinary Resolution of the Board. Any By-laws amendments will be submitted to the Members at the next meeting of Members and, except for those amendments that are considered fundamental changes, the voting Members may confirm, reject or amend the By-laws by Ordinary Resolution.
- By a Member entitled to vote who may make a proposal to make, amend, or repeal a By-law in accordance with the Act which requires at least sixty (60) days' notice. Any By-laws amendments will be submitted to the Members at the next meeting of Members and, except for those amendments that are considered fundamental changes, the voting Members may confirm, reject or amend the By-laws by Ordinary Resolution.

8.2 EFFECTIVE DATE

By-laws amendments are effective from the date of the resolution of the Directors unless rejected or amended by the voting Members at a meeting of the Members.

9.0 ARTICLE IX NOTICE

- 9.1 WRITTEN NOTICE** In these By-laws, written notice will mean notice which is hand-delivered or provided by mail, fax, electronic mail or courier to the address of record of the individual, Director, Officer, or Member, as applicable
- 9.2 DATE OF NOTICE** Date of notice will be the date on which receipt of the notice is confirmed verbally where the notice is hand-delivered, electronically where the notice is faxed or emailed, or in writing where the notice is couriered, or in the case of notice that is provided by mail, five (5) days after the date the mail is post-marked
- 9.3 ERROR IN NOTICE** The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting of the Board or of the Members, the failure of any Director or Member to receive notice, or an error in any notice which does not affect its substance will not invalidate any action taken at the Meeting.

10.0 ARTICLE X DISSOLUTION

- 10.1 DISSOLUTION** The Corporation may be dissolved in accordance with the Act.

11.0 ARTICLE XI INDEMNIFICATION

- 11.1 WILL INDEMNIFY** The Corporation will indemnify and hold harmless out of the funds of the Corporation each Director and any individual who acts at the Corporation's request in a similar capacity, their heirs, executors and administrators from and against any and all claims, charges, expenses, demands, actions or costs, including an amount paid to settle an action or satisfy a judgment, which may arise or be incurred as a result of occupying the position or performing the duties of a Director or and any individual who acts at the Corporation's request in a similar capacity.
- 11.2 WILL NOT INDEMNIFY** The Corporation will not indemnify a Director or any individual who acts on behalf of the Corporation for acts of fraud, dishonesty, bad faith, breach of any statutory duty or responsibility. For further clarity, the Corporation will not indemnify an individual unless:
- 11.2.1 The individual acted honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the Corporation; and
 - 11.2.2 If the matter is a criminal or administrative proceeding that is enforced by a monetary penalty, the individual had reasonable grounds for believing that his or her conduct was lawful.
- 11.3 INSURANCE** The Corporation will, at all times, maintain in force such Directors and Officers liability insurance

12.0 ARTICLE XII FUNDAMENTAL CHANGES

12.1 FUNDAMENTAL CHANGES Under the jurisdiction of the *Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act*, a Special Resolution of all Members (whether voting or non-voting) is required to make the following fundamental changes to the By-laws or articles of the Corporation. Fundamental Changes are defined as follows:

- 12.1.1 Change the Corporation's name;
- 12.1.2 Add, change or remove any restriction on the activities that the Corporation may carry on;
- 12.1.3 Create a new category of Members;
- 12.1.4 Change a condition required for being a Member;
- 12.1.5 Change the designation of any category of Members or add, change or remove any rights and conditions of any such category;
- 12.1.6 Divide any category of Members into two or more categories and fix the rights and conditions of each category;
- 12.1.7 Add, change or remove a provision respecting the transfer of a membership;
- 12.1.8 Increase or decrease the number of, or the minimum or maximum number of, Directors;
- 12.1.9 Change the purposes of the corporation;
- 12.1.10 Change to whom the property remaining on liquidation after the discharge of any liabilities of the Corporation is to be distributed;
- 12.1.11 Change the manner of giving notice to Members entitled to vote at a meeting of Members;
- 12.1.12 Change the method of voting by Members not in attendance at a meeting of the Members; or
- 12.1.13 Add, change or remove any other provision that is permitted by the Act.

13.0 ARTICLE XIII ADOPTION OF THESE BY-LAWS

13.1 RATIFICATION These By-laws were ratified by a Special Resolution vote of the Members of the Corporation at a meeting of Members duly called and held on May 31, 2014, effective June 2, 2014.

13.2 REPEAL OF PRIOR BY-LAWS In ratifying these By-laws, the Members of the Corporation repeal all prior By-laws of the Corporation provided that such repeal does not impair the validity of any action done pursuant to the repealed By-laws.
